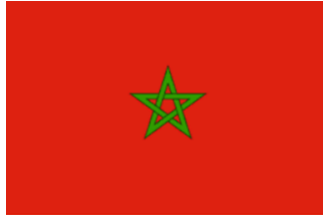

## Morocco

Your young explorers were busy learning about the flag and terrain of Morocco - it's not all desert! During week 2, we'll be listening to some folktales from Morocco. We'll also be learning about the foods of Morocco, and the importance of gathering for meals around the cooking pot. They will get to make a model of a cooking pot. A cultural informant will be going us to tell us first hand about Morocco. Here's this week's cool fact about Morocco: Morocco is about the same size as the state of California!

## Portugal

It was great fun meeting all our young explorers this week. The group was especially interested to learn about some of the rare animals found in Portugal when we went on a virtual field trip. Students crafted Portuguese flags as they learned how flags are used to communicate ideas. The castles on the present day flag represent the role of monarchs through the ages.



Next week students will compare/contrast different versions of the story Stone Soup. They will paint a Galo de Barcelos - the Portuguese symbol of good luck - as they learn the folktale about this famous rooster. We will also learn about how explorers from the Iberian Peninsula spread their languages and cultures around the world.

## South Korea

The virtual tour to South Korea was a long journey but amazing! Students enjoyed being able to experience the country through the app Nearpod. They had the opportunity to see 360 degree views of National Parks, temples and homes in South Korea. This week students will have the opportunity to create typical foods commonly served in South Korea such as mandu, kimchi and rice. Often times, Koreans use chopsticks to eat their foods. Students will have the opportunity to practice using chopsticks. Make sure to ask them if it was hard or easy to use them. We will also be learning about traditional clothing that Koreans wear for special ceremonies and celebrations.

4. Have you seen the Arlington County Flag, Logo, or Seal? Your child has! On it is a representation of the Arlington House, which is free to visit thanks to the National Park Services (Happy 100th Birthday NPS! #FindYourPark)! <https://www.nps.gov/arho/index.htm> Our students are noticing this symbol on local buses, library signs, and trucks!
5. Preview next week's lesson on urban gardening and Farmer's Markets by visiting an Arlington Farmer's Market! <https://topics.arlingtonva.us/farmers-markets/> Sample fresh fruit and veggies, look at heirloom plants, experience the community togetherness, and learn about sustainable farming practices from around our area.
